 - Green grass
 - Fresh air

- Watch:
- Animals eating
 - Leaf falling to the ground
 - Spider web w/insect
 - Ant moving something
 - Wind blowing the leaves
 - Clouds going by
 - For something funny
 - For something unusual
 - Sunlight coming through trees
 - Reflection in the water
 - Trail markers
 - Animal homes or shelters
